In an effort to honor that friendship and the work these two women did in the community and at the YWCA, we have launched programming designed to impact racial issues in the Greenville Community.

The Face-to-Face program is designed to pair two people of different backgrounds together with the goal of having a candid conversation about racism. There will be four group meetings at the YWCA of Greenville, and four meetings for the pair. Participants will be provided with materials to guide and facilitate discussions.

As a participant of the Face-to-Face program, you would agree to be open and honest in all of our discussions. We are working toward systemic change and cannot achieve this without your full participation.

The YWCA of Greenville will provide a safe, welcoming, and confidential atmosphere for the program. All participants agree to keep the information and experiences shared confidential.

Participants will take a confidential pre-evaluation and a post-evaluation to gauge the level of understanding of topics that will be covered in the program.
