Programs

Homebase at Fernhurst Residence

Homebase at Fernhurst gives women safe housing—and the chance to transform the course of their futures.

This YWCA program offers eligible women the opportunity to prepare for a transition from challenging life circumstances to permanent housing.

Through the Homebase program, women and their children are offered a clean and affordable place to live, two daily meals, access to an on-site computer lab, and additional mentoring and learning opportunities. Homebase participants are also asked to contribute to the community by volunteering two hours of their time each week.

These resources, along with a low-cost living arrangement and daily meals, enable each woman to achieve her goals.



A Homebase Success Story

When Debbie* came to the YWCA, she had been battling health problems. A sudden onset of illness caused Debbie to lose time at work and forced her to quit her job. Debbie was left unemployed, in need of surgery and unable to pay her rent.

A friend helped her move to Fernhurst and paid her initial rent payment. When she recovered from surgery, Debbie gradually took on regular rent payments and volunteered as part of her contribution our Homebase program.

An Aquatics Success Story

The YWCA in Kokokahi runs the Adaptive Swim for the Hawai'i State Department of Education, which provides swim instruction to students with severe impairments. Although progress takes much patience, the accomplishments made by each student are amazing.

Coach Erin who has been running the program for the last 7 years says, "This is why I teach swimming—there is so much joy in seeing these students blossom in the water."

Charlene* started the program 5 years ago feeling terrified of the water, unable to even put a foot on the pool steps. With patience and understanding from all her instructors, she is now able to jump in at the deep end of the pool and come up with a smile on her face.

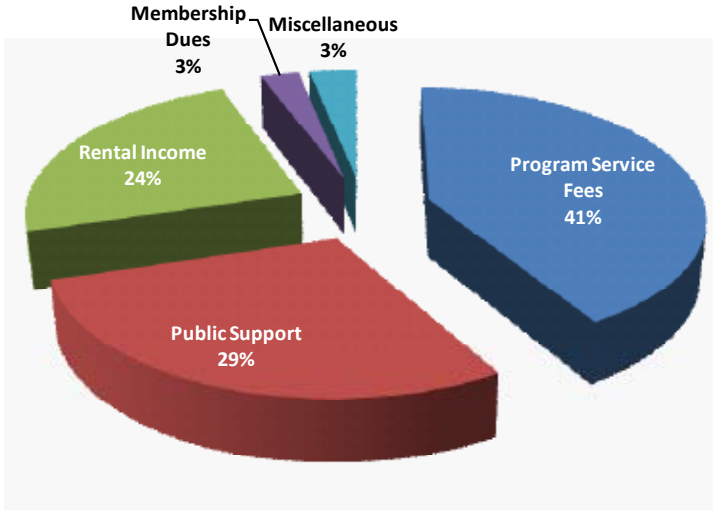

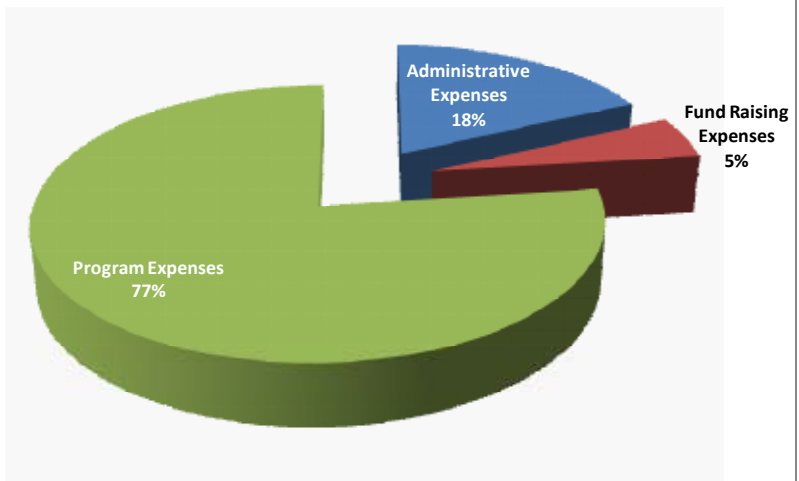
