

Supervised visitation allows non-custodial parties and their child(ren) to spend time together. A trained supervisor is present during the entire visit to ensure the physical safety as well as the emotional well-being of the child(ren). Supervised visitation is court-mandated if there is an allegation of abuse, neglect, “fear of flight”, or an order of protection against the non-custodial party.

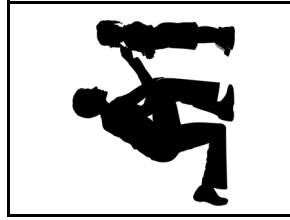

Where Do The Visits Take Place?



Visits through the YWCA's Supervised Visitation Program take place in New Windsor and Middletown. Our visitation rooms are filled with age appropriate activities to help make the experience more warm and comfortable.

How Long Do The Visits Last?

Visitation time is for a duration of 1-2 hours.

What Happens During a Typical Visit?

Non-custodial parties and the children have the opportunity to communicate and interact with each other on a one-on-one basis. Books, toys and games are supplied, however, the non-custodial party and the children are allowed to bring these items to the visit.

The non-custodial party must arrive 15 minutes prior to the visit and leave 15 minutes after the custodial party leaves to eliminate any chance of contact between the two parties. The custodial party must be

prompt when dropping off and picking up their child(en) or a late fee will be assessed.

The custodial party leaves their child (ren) in the care of the supervisor who escorts the child(ren) to the visitation room. At the end of the visit the supervisor accompanies the child(ren) to re-join the custodial party.

Who Supervises The Visits?

The program supervisors are YWCA staff members who have been specially trained to make sure the child(ren) remains safe and secure during the visits. The supervisor may terminate the visit if:

- comments are made about pending court cases
- questions/comments are made regarding the custodial party
- drug or alcohol use is suspected
- either party possesses a weapon
- whispering/low tone talking occurs
- child(ren) expresses a desire for the visit to end

What Are The Fees For This Program?

The fee schedule is as follows:

- 1 hour.....\$25.00
- 1.5 hours.....\$37.50
- 2 hours.....\$50.00

Payment is due prior to the start of the session. Unless other arrangements have been ordered by the court, program fees are the responsibility of the non-custodial party.

How Can I Get The Visits Started?

All parties court-ordered to participate in this program must contact the YWCA at 845-561-8050 x22 to set up an appointment time to complete the intake forms and to see the visitation rooms before visits can actually take place. Once both parties complete all the necessary paperwork and a mutually convenient time and day has been established, the first visit will occur.
